Determined To Make A Difference – A Salute

Throughout my travels around the globe, I have met many who have changed society by words that were spoken, thoughts that were put into action or acts of sheer kindness. Anne Rutherford is a woman of God who has done all three. I never had the pleasure of meeting this mighty saint from Charlottesville, Virginia, but the love of Christ that dwells within her heart always speaks and introduces her wherever she goes.

As a Presbyterian missionary nurse, Anne Rutherford nursed countless orphans, needy children, elderly and destitute people of Zaire, now the Democratic Republic of Congo, to physical

and most importantly, spiritual health. She stayed out of harms way by her faith in God for preservation. In January of 2001, Anne instructed numerous classes on healing in Chogoria Hospital in Chogoria, Kenya. Many were blessed by the teachings and received knowledge of how to live the God-type of abundant life.

The Holy Spirit led Anne to partner with The JOSHUA Foundation through its child sponsorship campaign. After teaching healing in Chogoria, a mother approached Anne about her sick daughter and granddaughter who live in Uganda, East Africa, a neighboring country to

Kenya. Immediately, she was moved with compassion, as was Jesus in Mark 1:41. Anne decided that she was determined to make a difference in the lives of this destitute woman, Patricia Kanjiru, and her daughter, Lara Mwendu. Patricia was originally diagnosed with tuberculosis and later with HIV disease. Patricia's husband died two years prior
